

'National' Results

The public relations officer of the NAWB reports on this years successful meeting at Scarborough

Close on 700 enthusiastic winemakers and brewers thoroughly enjoyed a magnificent weekend as guests of the Mayor and Corporation of Scarborough in North Yorkshire, on Friday 11th to Sunday 13th of April. This was the Annual Show and Conference weekend of the National Association of Wine & Beermakers, and the occasion of the Association's Annual General Meeting. This is the biggest event in amateur winemaking in Britain, and as far as I know, in the world.

A small group of Committee members and other devotees arrived on the Thursday, struggling through a bitterly cold gale, to be sure of an early start on the Friday. Much work has to be done before the first bottle is on the horizon: tables have to be set up, allocated to classes according to the number of entries received for each one, and covered with banquetting paper, signs erected for each class, the extremely valuable array of silver trophies suitably displayed, the computer set up for the recording of the results and their analysis as the judging proceeds, and a thousand and one other tasks that have to be undertaken. Carload after carload of supplies and equipment have to be unloaded and ferried into the Show Complex, and one member had to make a round trip of ninety miles to collect the wines for the talk and tasting on Saturday afternoon.

By late afternoon on Friday the icy wind had abated a little, and entries were pouring in, with the Reception team doing a wonderful job of accepting some 4,650 bottles and other entries. Each bottle was handled by the stewards wearing plastic gloves, to ensure that no fingerprints would deface the bottles when the Judges came to make their appraisal.

One surprising aspect of the National this year was the lack of Trade support in the form of trade stands; only two stands were mounted, for a show that was much bigger than we have had for some years, and a show which one would have thought the members of the trade associations would have been glad to attend as a comparatively inexpensive form of publicity. One stand was for Dolly Bate's Cheese Ltd of Nantwich, a firm producing cheesemaking kits for do-it-yourself cheesemaking at home, a marvellous secondary occupation for amateur winemakers and beer brewers. What could be better than settling down with a pint of your own bitter and a cheese sandwich of your own making?

Incidentally, what is the word for making cheese? How about fromagerie? It has that naughty French ring to it, and sounds almost like one of those strange practices Continentals are believed (doubtless wrongly) to indulge in. The other stand was a fine display of wine kits, equipment, additives and accessories, including the latest in Larsen kit wines that could be tasted as a finished product. This interesting stand was put on by 'Musts' of Yapton, a home-brew business run by two keen members of the Association, Sue Olford and John Whalley.

Peter and Anne Johnson, Yorkshire Federation Tombola experts, kindly offered their combined skills to NAWB, and took over the organisation and running of the Tombola at Scarborough. This year the Tombola showed a substantial profit; perhaps this was in part due to Anne, a past National Wine Queen, charming the customers. Whatever the secret of their success, they did a grand job.

Judy Irwin, NAWB Hon. Sec., aided by Doris Hughes and various other friends and relations, manned the NAWB table, selling ties and car stickers, accepting subscriptions, distributing voting slips for the AGM, and generally providing a good service for potential new members, publicity in general, and a convenient stopping place for a kindly word.

Among the new trophies being competed for for the first time was the Maurice Hughes Memorial Trophy, a handsome silver cup donated by his friends in recognition of the affection in which this well-known winemaker and National Judge engendered in everyone who had known him.

Friday evening was the occasion of a dance and social event in the Ocean Room in the Spa Complex, that range of buildings housing Ballrooms, Halls, and many other rooms such as bars,

restaurants, dressing rooms and so on, all that is needed to stage any sort of Conference or Entertainment. The Complex is situated at the foot of the cliffs in South Bay, facing across the sands and the North Sea. The evening was a great success, with almost all the near-700 booked in for the Show being present and having a wonderful time. The Fancy Dress competition was really well supported, with more entries than have ever been seen before. A raffle was held, for an assortment of spirits, and a dozen wines presented by J Sainsbury plc.

Later, 10p coins were slid across the polished floor with much enthusiasm to win a litre bottle of Scotch Whisky. The winning marksman was Mr M B Norman, Chairman of Nottingham Wine Circle.

Saturday morning brought the Judges' and Stewards' briefing, when Norman Chiverton, Convenor, advised everyone of their duties, and how various rules were to be followed, and then announced the classes to which each judge and steward had been allocated. After that it was all hands to the pump, and the judging was under way. One hundred and eleven members of the National Guild of Wine & Beer Judges undertook the mammoth task, which was practically finished by lunchtime. After lunch, the Judges answered queries and discussed their findings at a 'Judges at the Bar' session, the time when any exhibitor can ask about his or her wines, beers or food entries, and perhaps benefit a little from the judge's accumulated experience.

There then followed what must have been one of the biggest talks and tastings of commercial wines on record in our hobby. Roy Ekins, Committee and NGWBJ member, donned yet another hat in his rôle as Sainsbury's Wine Speaker, and gave an amusing and instructive hour's discourse on a selection of that Company's wines to over five hundred and fifty members and guests.

In the evening we were the guests of the Mayor, represented by the Deputy Mayor, Mr Erkki Lahteela and his charming wife Celia. This delightful couple quickly won the hearts of all present, and demonstrated once again the kindly way in which the people of Scarborough welcome winemakers who visit their town. Scarborough is, by the way, the venue each year for the Yorkshire Federation's Annual Show, so there is a bond between this town and our hobby that shows readily in the way we are received there. Much energetic dancing took place to the lively music of the Paul James band, and during the interval there was a supper provided for us as the Mayor's guests. Afterwards we sat and had a really enjoyable half-hour or so being entertained by a cabaret turn given by Paul Travis, a tireless and uproariously funny young



man who had his audience almost falling off their chairs with laughter at times. The evening continued in the good-humoured way until the music stopped, whereupon everyone returned happily to their hotels, some to enjoy the sleep of the just, some to continue carousing until the early hours of Sunday morning.

Came the dawn! And the last few went to bed, while the lesser mortals among us turned over for another hour or so's shut-eye. But by 10 am we were all back in the Ocean Room, (which had been miraculously aired and cleaned by the Corporation staff) for the Annual General Meeting, presided over by our President Mrs Freda Stagg, and controlled by the Association Chairman, Mr Lenn Drysdale. What took place is, of course, only the concern of the Association's members, but I do not think I am breaking any confidences when I report what was said by so many members in my hearing, that Scarborough 1986 was the best National for many years. There was a tremendous spirit of goodwill throughout, everyone joined in to make it a great success; I can honestly report as Public Relations Officer for the Association that I received not one complaint of any sort during the weekend - except for the lady in one party whom I personally guided to the Ocean Room late in the evening on Saturday, and she then complained because she - out of 700 or so present - hadn't got a better table position! You just can't win 'em all!

Then came one of the highlights of the weekend, the Grand Draw, for prizes including a weekend trip to France, a food processor, a case of Bulgarian wines, a year's subscription to

the *Winemaker*, and several other valuable prizes. The major prize, a weekend in Paris, was won by Mrs J Coulshed of Whitley Bay, Tyne & Wear.

After the Annual General Meeting we had the pleasure once again of the presence of the Deputy Mayor and Mayoress, who after a few words, graciously awarded the trophies won on the Saturday; a list of these awards is given separately. Pre-eminent among these were the Amateur Winemaker Shield for the Circle gaining most points overall, won by Phoenix; the Bournemouth Master Winemaker Cup for the most points over 18 classes, won by Mrs A Evans of St Albans; the Wilf Newsom Cup for the Master Brewer to P Hardy of Plymouth; and the NAWB Trophy for the Master Wine & Beer-maker of the Year jointly to A Procter and K Simpson, both of Phoenix.

And then, after a farewell from our President, who wished us all a safe journey home, and her hopes to see us all - and more - at Llandudno in 1987, the Chairman brought the proceedings to a close.

This had been an exceptional National, enjoyed by all who attended, with record attendances, record entries, and fair weather on the whole in a delightful setting. All that now remains is to look forward to 1987 at Llandudno, where we are making our first visit to Wales. Book the date now - Llandudno on the 10th to 12th April 1987. Members of the National Association will receive details through their newsletter 'News & Views', and non-members will be notified through the winemaking press when schedules are available.
